Programme

Friday 23 August, 10am - midday

Event Governance Workshop facilitated by Brendon O'Connor from O'Connor Sinclair.

Learn what a difference the right governance set up can mean for your event. Brendon will take you through the pros and cons of different event governance structures and then hear from two of Audi quattro Winter Games New Zealand's key players - Sir Eion Edgar, the Board Chairman and Arthur Klap, the Event Director.

Friday 23 August, 12:45pm - 3.30pm

The afternoon session will include brief presentations from key staff from the Audi quattro Winter Games New Zealand. Areas covered will include (but not be limited to) volunteers, the Downtown Festival, sponsorship, media and sports and venue management. These sessions will be designed to be as interactive as possible to ensure that key learning's from the event are shared, along with best practice and advice.

Friday 23 August, 3.45pm - 5:00pm

After being indoors all day, it is time to move off site to the Earnslaw Park Event Village, to examine first-hand the operational management of the event village in the heart of Queenstown.

Friday 23 August, Evening

- Organisers will endeavour to remain as close as possible to the proposed itinerary for the Observer Programme. However, organisers reserve the right to change the programme if deemed necessary;
- Due to the limited numbers available on the Observer Programme, confirmed attendees that cancel their

attendance 14 days prior to Friday 23rd August may be charged a cancellation fee (accommodation and flight cancellation fees are separate);

- Accommodation and transport to and from Queenstown are the sole responsibility of the person attending the programme;
- A change in personnel attending from an organisation will be at the discretion of the organisers and must be requested in advance of the Observer Programme commencing;
- Priority will be given to first time attendees to this or any other Major Event Development Fund invested event Observer Programme; and
- In the first instance, one representative per organisation will be prioritised for the programme. Acceptance to attend the Observer Programme is at the sole and absolute discretion of the organisers.
